Introduction:

Background:

Youths are capable of presenting a beautiful society by removing all the social obstacles, a group of young of Dengapara village of Patiya Upazila under the Chittagong District can be a good example. The people of Dengapara village were neglected and deprived of their basic needs and rights such as education, food, cloth, shelter and medicine etc.

In order to gain those rights, the NOWZUWAN (as Club or CBO) was established in 1977 by a group of ambitious youths, whose activities were limited on sports, literature and cultural competition. It got legality from the Department of Social Welfare in 1980 with the help of former MP and its founder member Mr. Sirajul Islam Chowdhury. After some years running decreased their club activities due to family affairs activities of founder members. Later some another youths of Dengapara took responsibility of the CBO in 1988. They re-organized the CBO through setting an office and making a constitution. In 1992, they started economic and social development activities along with continuing sports and literature activities, with the name NOWZUWAN Club (CBO). At present, the development activities of NOWZUWAN club have been expanded from Dengapara village to various upazilas/thanas of Chittagong District and Chittagong City Corporation. NOWZUWAN is now performing purely as NGO, a social welfare organization, and has been implementing its multi dimensional development activities ever since.

Governance System:

NOWZUWAN is governed by an Executive Committee (Elects for two years by General Members) consisting of 7 (seven) members from various professions, including 20 (twenty) General Members and 11 (eleven) Life Members and it has advisor committee with 11 (eleven) members. The Executive Committee formulates the technical and financial principles for the organization and the Chief Executive as well as the General Secretary, on behalf of the Executive Committee conducts the proper management of the organization.

Supervision, Monitoring, Follow up & Reporting System:

The Program staff will ensure close supervision, frequently monitoring, regular follow up and reporting for qualitative achievement. Program staff will meet monthly for reviewing the progress and performance of the activities and prepare action plan for the next month. Program staffs submit their monthly report to the Program Chief of NOWZUWAN for necessary action. The Chief is responsible for submitting the report to the Donor in due time.

Financial Control Management:

All sorts of Program Grant and Loan Fund are kept in a separate Bank Account of NOWZUWAN, which operated by joint signatory. Accounts will be maintained as per donors' rules and Bangladesh standard rules. The books of accounts, Vouchers and Records of the Program are preserved for verification and audit through Chartered Accounts firms annually. The said report are submitted to the donor in due time.

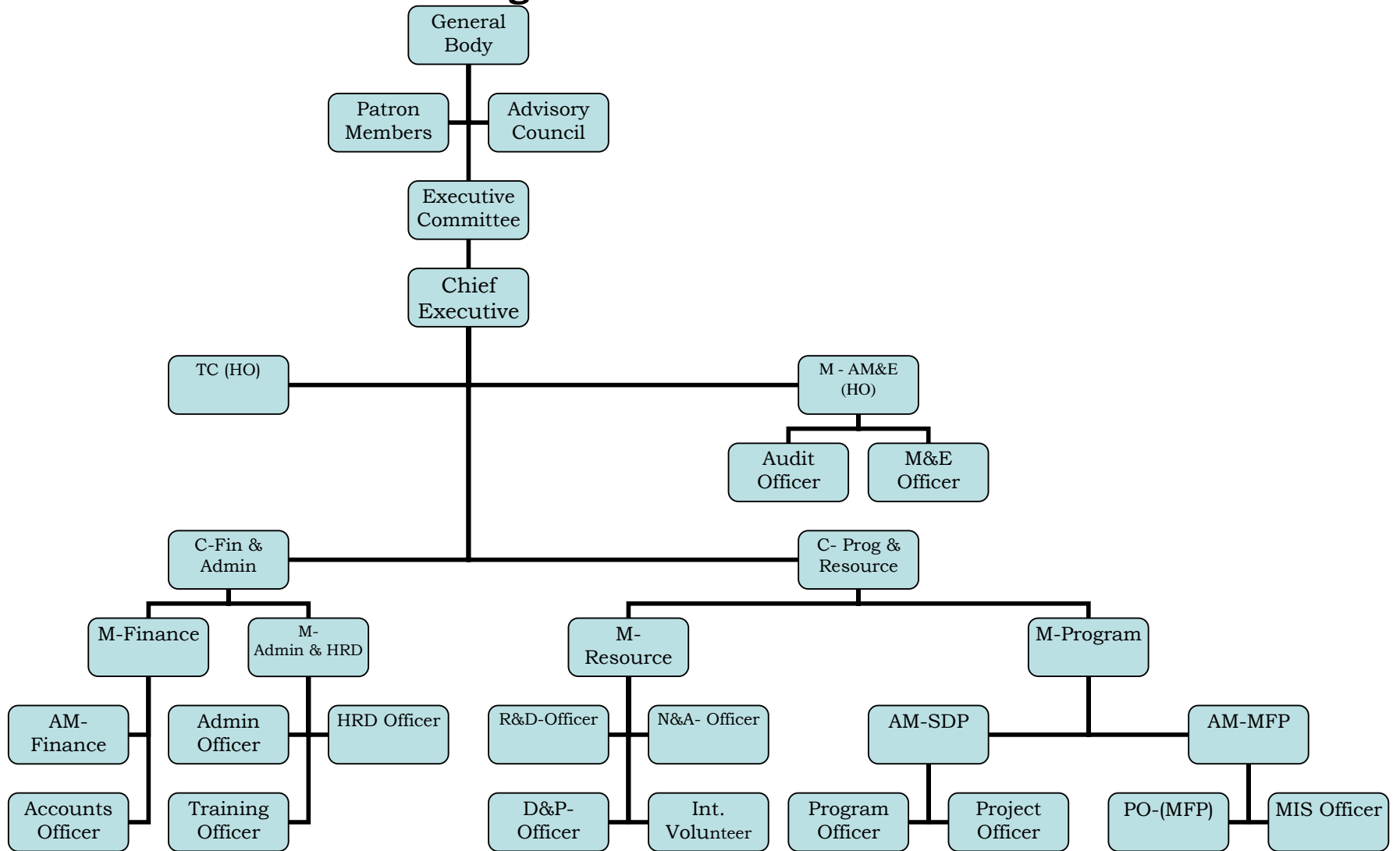
